An athlete will qualify his or her NOC at the Qualification Events. The NOC shall select the athlete that attends the Youth Olympic Games.

Continental Championships Qualification Events

For the Windsurfer and 1 person Dinghy events, there will be a series of Continental Qualification Events. The venue, format and equipment for each of the events shall be approved by the ISAF.

To be eligible to qualify an NOC at a Continental Qualification Event, an athlete must be a national of a country within that Continent as defined by the ISAF.

World Championships Qualification Events

For the Windsurfer and 1 person Dinghy events, there will be a World Championship Qualification Event. The venue, format and equipment for each of the events shall be approved by the ISAF.

An athlete from any continent may qualify his/her NOC at the World Championship Qualification Events.

HOST COUNTRY REPRESENTATION

The host country will automatically qualify for all 4 events providing that it competes in each of the 4 events of the Asian Qualification Events.

UNIVERSALITY PLACES

To be eligible to receive Universality Places, athletes must comply with the Eligibility criteria as defined under point C. of this document.

There will be 8 Universality places available depending on if the technical level allows it.

In order to be eligible for a Universality Place, an NOC must compete in either its respective continental qualification event or in the World Championships Qualification Events.

An NOC will initially be offered only one Universality Place; however, through the re-allocation of Unused Quota Places it may be offered further places.

E. Confirmation process for quota places

CONFIRMATION PROCESS FOR QUALIFICATION PLACES

Immediately following each of the Qualification Events, the ISAF will write to the NOCs and Member National Authorities (MNAs) that have qualified.

NOCs will then have up to two weeks to confirm in writing to the ISAF and NYOGOC that they will use the obtained places.

The NOC deadline for accepting qualification places is 22 June 2014.

F. Reallocation of unused quota places

| REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUALIFICATION PLACES |

| <p>Where possible the boys’ and girls’ quotas should be maintained along with the Continental representation set out in the Qualification Pathway table. Unused qualification places will be offered only to NOCs that competed in a Qualification Event.</p> <p>Following each of the Continental Qualification Events, the ISAF will produce an “Unused Quota Places Reallocation List” based on the results of each of the Continental Qualification Events. This list will rank the NOCs in order of the results within each continent.</p> <p>There will be three stages of reallocation of unused qualification places as defined below.</p> <p>Stage 1)</p> <p>Where places become available they will be reallocated within the same continent to the next best ranked NOC that has not already qualified in any of the sailing events according to the Unused Quota Places Reallocation List.</p> <p>Stage 2)</p> <p>If there are still places to reallocate after completion of Stage 1, the unused qualification places will then be reallocated within the same continent to the best ranked NOC according to the Unused Quota Places Reallocation List that is already represented in one other sailing event, then two, and so on until all qualification places are filled.</p> <p>Stage 3)</p> <p>If there are still places to reallocate after completion of Stage 1 and Stage 2, the unused qualification places will then be reallocated to another continent. The priority order of the continents will be: Africa, Oceania, Central & South America, North America & Caribbean and Europe. For each continent places will be reallocated to the next best ranked NOC according to the Unused Quota Places Reallocation List that has not already qualified in any of the sailing events, then one, then two and so on until all qualification places are filled.</p> |
